How the Three Proposed Budgets Stack Up for K-12

Outgoing Governor Northam proposed a new two-year state budget before leaving office, spanning July 2022 to June 2024. On February 20th, the Virginia Senate and House put forth their budget proposals. Compared to the Governor's proposal, the Senate budget increases K-12 funding and the House cuts funding. Yet, there were important investments in each budget that should be considered for the final budget negotiated and voted on by March 12th. Below is a comparison of the budgets by major K-12 categories, focusing on areas of difference.
